



then. However, the study of law ceased to be taught for the years 1952-1981 as a result of the dissolution of the Section of Law of the Faculty of Law and Socio-Economics Sciences caused by the communist authorities. At present, the Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration, the successor of those faculties, continues the ninety-year-old juridical tradition at our



Alma Mater by combining the studies of law, canon law, administration and recently: European studies.

The characteristic feature of studies at our University concentrates on the universal and humanistic, and not only the professional aspect of education. According to this assumption, the curricula, besides the core, fundamental legal subjects, additionally encompass general lectures on issues pertaining to the world of values, ethics, Catholic social science and the discipline of thinking.

The Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration having its share in the University mission, following the idea of Deo et Patriae, endeavors to train future lawyers, so that they will be capable of boldly facing the contemporary challenges and become creatively involved in the process of national transformation as well as being able to assume the new tasks necessitated by the technological progress, globalisation and Polish integration with the European Union structures and utilize their skills and education pro publico bono.


THE MISSION OF JOHN PAUL II CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY OF LUBLIN




On 27 July 1918, on the initiative of the Rev. Idzi Radziszewski, the Polish Episcopate established the Catholic University of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in Lublin with Radziszewski taking the office of rector (university president). After the death of Pope John Paul II, the University Senate convened for an extraordinary meeting on 4 April 2005 resolved to name the University after John Paul II as homage paid to the great Polish Pope.

The University's mission is to conduct research in the spirit of harmony between science and faith, as well as educating and nurturing the Catholic intelligentsia and fostering Christian culture. The identity of the University is manifested in: special attention to the high level of research and graduate education, the study and dissemination of the Christian vision of man and the world against the backdrop of contemporary challenges, the concern for the preservation and cultivation of the most precious traditions of the homeland and, with this end in view, the formation of young generations; moreover, this identity is demonstrated through the University's pursuing policies related to its location in Lublin, the city hosting the Union of Lublin establishing the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth in 1569. It is the *University's name, the name of its patron and its motto* Deo et Patrie that urge the academic community to advocate its identity.

The historical legacy of Lublin calls for an active involvement - also in collaboration with other universities and non-academic institutions - in the affairs of the city and the region.



HISTORY OF THE FACULTY







The origins of legal studies at the Catholic University of Lublin are strictly associated with the history and the emergence of the University, which opened in 1918. The University founding fathers, who in the interwar period conceived a universal research and educational program, envisaged a program in law and created two juridical faculties: Faculty of Canon Law and Moral Sciences and the Faculty of Law and Socio-Economic Sciences with the Legal Section being of first concern.

Faculty of Canon Law and Moral Sciences

In the interwar period, the Faculty of Canon Law was the only autonomous faculty of this discipline in Poland. At other academic centers in Poland (Krakow, Lviv, Warsaw, Vilnius), canon law was taught within theological departments. After the end of World War II, the Faculty of Canon Law resumed its activity and operated continuously until 1984, when it was incorporated in the newly established Faculty of Canon Law and Legal Studies.

Faculty of Law and Socio-Economic Sciences

In the period from the University's inception to 1952, law at the Catholic University of Lublin was taught within the Faculty of Law and Socio-Economic Sciences. The Lublin-based Faculty of Law was one of six others that operated in the Second Polish Republic.

The first instructors employed by the faculty arrived from various universities, primarily from Jan Kazimierz University in Lviv. The staff permanently associated with the faculty included: Roman Longchamps de Berier, an outstanding civil law expert, and Zbigniew Pazdro, a professor of administrative law. Other researchers and teachers of long standing permanently associated with the University were: Ignacy Czuma, Wit Klonowiecki, Henryk Dembiński, Zdzisław Papierkowski, Antoni Pastuszka; affiliated with the Catholic University, not only formally but also ideologically, they continued their work after World War II.

The years after World War II saw a rapid development of the Legal Section at the Faculty of Law and Socio-Economic Sciences. In 1944, the Catholic University of Lublin was the first institution of higher education on Polish territory that reopened during the ongoing warfare. However, the development of the faculty, including its Legal Section, was stopped following the decision of the Minister of Education worded in a letter dated 23 June 1949 and addressed, "To the Citizen Rector of the Catholic University of Lublin." By invoking the relevant decree, the minister ordered "a gradual dissolution of the Legal Section of the Faculty of Law and Socio-Economic Sciences at the Catholic University of Lublin." The Legal Section ultimately ceased to operate in 1952.

The dissolution of the Faculty of Law and Socio-Economic Sciences marked the first stage of a deliberate policy implemented by the Communist authorities that aimed to hinder the impact of the Catholic University of Lublin on the training and education of academic youth. The Communists' utmost objective was to ideologise and exploit law for the regime's purposes.

The initiative of restoring the Legal Section was promoted by the Rev. Prof. Józef Krukowski, the then dean of Faculty of Canon Law, at the turn of the 1970s. The section reopened in 1981 at the Faculty of Canon Law. In 1984 the faculty was renamed the Faculty of Canon Law and Legal Sciences.

From the very beginning, among the section's personnel there were: Rev. Józef Krukowski, Rev. Henryk Karbownik, Rev. Henryk Misztal, and professors who, despite their achievements and expertise, were not able to find employment at state universities because of their political views or activities: Adam Strzembosz, Wiesław Chrzanowski and Władysław Rostocki. The Legal Section continued to grow and new researchers were employed: Wojciech Łączkowski, Jan Widacki, Jerzy Wratny, Hanna Suchocka. In addition, the section admitted lecturers from other academic centers. From Maria Curie-Skłodowska University: Jan Ziembiński, Henryk Reniger, Andrzej Wąsek, Wanda Wójtowicz, Marek Kuryłowicz, Mirosław Granat; from the Jagiellonian University: Edward Drozd; from Warsaw University: Tadeusz Ereciński and Marek Safian.

Faculty of Canon and Civil Law

In 1989 the name of the faculty was again modified to the Faculty of Canon and Civil Law. Rev. Prof. Marian Stasiak was appointed to the post of the faculty dean and remained on his post until 1999. In the 1990's, the following professors were employed at the Section of Law: Jan Świtka, Andrzej Szajkowski, Henryk Cioch, Józef Skoczylas, Stanisław Wrzosek and Kazimierz Kruczalak. Since the time of the Section revival, the number of young scholars has gradually increased; they are mostly the graduates of the Faculty of Law.





Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration

After establishing a new major of administration in 1999, the name of the faculty changed into the Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration. Today, the faculty is structured into four institutes: the Institute of Law, the Institute of Canon Law, the Institute of Administration and the Institute of European Studies (created in 2009).


The faculty offers programs in four dysciplines: law, canon law, administration and European studies. The courses are full-time and part-time. Currently, faculty personnel total 133 employees; there are 4,640 students, including 1,796 law students, 242 canon law students, 1,682 administration students and 266 undergraduates pursuing European studies, 222 graduates attend PhD programs. In addition the faculty offers a number of postgraduate courses.

An important element of the faculty's involvement in the social and political reality is the cooperation with governmental and nongovernmental organizations and contribution to the work of parliamentary committees. Their research activity is discernible through the organization and participation in international and national conferences and seminars that gather academics and practitioners of law. Their outcome is promoted through scientific publications on political and social reforms, European law, economic law, constitutional law, state finance, law of State - Church relations, concordat law or matrimonial law.

The faculty works in close collaboration with the legal academia in Europe and the U.S., for example: Pázmány Péter Catholic University in Budapest, Catholic University of Leuven, Catholic University of the Sacred Heart in Milan, Charles University in Prague, Vytautas Magnus University in Kaunas, Ivan Franko University in Lviv, Vilnius

University, Aldo Moro University of Bari, Kiev National University and the universities in Alba Iulia, Sassari, Olomouc and Passau. Further, it cooperates with: Chicago-Kent College of Law, University of Notre Dame, the Canonical Institute in Podsdam (Kanonistischen Institut), the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, the Society for Legal Policy in Trier (Stiftung Gesellschaft für Rechtspolitik) and the Association for Religion and Religious Liberty in the European Union, based in Bischofsgrün (Gesellschaft für Religion und Religionsfreiheit in der Europäischen Union e.V.), the Slovakian Canonist Association and the Polish Canonist Association.

Cardinal August Hlond - for his contribution as the Primate of Poland to the organization of the Polish Church in the Regained Territories (western Poland); the honor was proposed by the Faculty of Canon Law (1948).

Servant of God Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński doctor of canon law and a graduate of the Faculty of
Canon Law, Catholic University of Lublin; he was
conferred the honor for his contribution to the
dissemination of philosophical knowledge and for
scientific achievements in the province of Christian
philosophy, especially social ethics, and for his work for
the Faculty of Christian Philosophy during his term as
the Grand Chancellor of the Catholic University of
Lublin; the honor was proposed by the Faculty of
Christian Philosophy (1949).

Fr. Prof. Gommar Michiels - Dean of the Faculty of Canon Law (1924-1928 and 1931-1935) - for a long, dedicated work for the University, and especially for his input in the organization of studies and his outstanding work as a tutor and researcher, which garnered the University country and Europe-wide recognition; the honor was proposed by the Faculty of Theology (1957).

Bishop Prof. Piotr Kałwa - Dean of the Faculty of Canon Law (1939 and 1946-1950) - for his dedication to the Catholic University of Lublin during his 30-years of work as a professor; for exemplary research and teaching achievements, especially in the field of Polish ecclesiastical law, the honor was proposed by the Faculty of Theology (1958).

Archbishop Prof. Émile-Arsène Blanchet - for his scientific input, especially in connection with exercising the authority of Rector of the Catholic Institute in Paris; the honor was proposed by the Faculty of Canon Law (1964).

Venerable Servant of God John Paul II - in admiration for the integrity of his doctrine on human dignity and value of the human person, as well as for unrelenting defense of human rights in the modern world; the honor granted by common consent of all the University faculties (1983).

Prof. Paul Mikat - for outstanding scientific achievements and contribution to the Catholic University of Lublin, linked to his political and social activity; the honor was proposed by the Faculty of Canon and Civil Law (1990).

Bishop Prof. Eugenio Corecco - for his superior contribution to the development of canon law; the honor proposed by the Faculty of Canon and Secular Law (1994).

Archbishop Szczepan Wesoły - for his contribution to fostering the spiritual heritage of the Polish nation and promotion of Christian culture among Polish communities abroad made during his overseas pastoral service and while serving as a delegate of the Polish Primate for emigrant ministry; the honor was proposed by the Faculty of Canon and Civil Law (1996).





Cardinal Prof. Zenon Grocholewski - for his exceptional contribution to the development of the study of canon law and promotion of the legal culture of the Catholic Church in the contemporary world; for the ecclesiastical significance of his ministry at the Supreme Tribunal of the Apostolic Signatura and promotion of Poland world-wide; the honor was proposed by the Faculty of Canon and Civil Law (1999).

Prof. Bernd Rüthers - in recognition of his outstanding scientific achievements in the theory of law and efforts aimed to rest law on a system of moral values in accordance with the teachings of the Church; for his contribution to the research on building employee relations conforming to Catholic social teaching; the honor was proposed by the Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration (2000).

Archbishop Józef Kowalczyk - for adhering to the mission of the Apostolic Nuncio in Poland marked by great concern for the Roman Catholic Church in Poland and the Polish nation; in recognition of his achievements in the normalization of the Church's condition in Poland; the honor was proposed by the Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration (2001).

Cardinal Prof. Peter Erdö - in recognition of his output as an eminent canon law expert investigating the history of the sources and literature of canon law, matrimonial law, the law of the holy sacraments, concordat law and the problems of the relationships between rites. In his work and activities, he always attaches special attention to the significance of the Gospel and Christian values in European and world progress; the honor was proposed by the Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration (2005).

Cardinal Prof. Tarcisio Bertone - for a significant contribution to the study of canon law as a scholar and Secretary of State of the Holy See during the reform of public ecclesiastical law, inspired by the Second Vatican Council and concerning the relations between the Catholic Church and political and international communities; the honor was proposed by the Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration (2009).

Prof. Lech Kaczynski - as a token of respect and appreciation for the manner of exercising the authority of President of the Republic of Poland; for initiating and strengthening understanding among nations; for active participation in Polish public life; for reinforcing Poland's presence in the international arena; for a steadfast safeguarding of the national dignity, independence and security; for accepting the country's welfare and citizens' prosperity as the highest dictate; the honor was proposed by the Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration (2009).

The Institute of Law was inaugurated on 1 September 2008, pursuant to the resolution of the University Senate of 31 January 2008. It was created by the merger of four institutes: general legal sciences, private law, public law and criminal law.

The institute consists of 18 departments with over 90 scholars conducting their research and teaching activity. Many of them are distinguished academics and practitioners of law. The faculty is accredited to confer doctoral and postdoctoral degrees in law.

Law as a major offers full-time and part-time courses. The graduates may elect to continue their studies in doctoral programs (full and part-time) and postgraduate programs.

The teaching of law complies with ministerial standards. The training program acknowledges the guidelines of the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS). The students may participate in the international exchange program ERASMUS. Undergraduates

are required to complete obligatory professional training. Students also have the opportunity to broaden their practical skills as regards the provision of legal assistance by enrolling in the University Legal Clinic and the Center for Advancing Legal Skills. Moreover, the University-based School of American Law offers training in the American legal system delivered through a series of lectures in English. Full-time studies also offer a specialisation in the keystones of Ukrainian law.

The training of future lawyers adheres to the Christian system of values; consequently, when taking up employment in legal professions, state and local administration and in other sectors of social activity, the alumni not only display a thorough legal knowledge, but also a model Catholic stance.

Canon law studies at the Catholic University of Lublin go back to 1918. They have been conducted continuously since the University's inception. Currently, the Institute of Canon Law is comprised of 9 departments. Its personnel are 15 scholars, among them eminent professors of law, scholars from the Polish Academy of Sciences and renowned, international experts of extensive research and teaching experience. The institute leads the way among the research centers pursuing canon law studies and research. The institute is authorized to confer doctoral and postdoctoral degrees in canon law.

The institute offers courses in canon law as a major on a full-time and part-time basis. The institute is accredited by the National Accreditation Commission, has implemented the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) and offers international student exchange under the ERASMUS program.

The training objective is to introduce students to the law of the Catholic Churches. The introduction to the study of canon law involves insight into theology, philosophy and history. Further studies include mainly administrative and constitutional law of the Church, sacramental law, with particular emphasis on matrimonial law, monastic law, Church property law and public law. The curriculum lists compulsory courses in ecclesiastical procedural law (matrimonial, canoniza-

tion, administrative and criminal). The students may also participate in elective classes. During the final year, the undergraduates are assigned to professional training in episcopal courts. National and international conferences and open lectures organized by the institute's staff and students furnish some more opportunities of broadening the knowledge on the subject.

Beginning with the academic year 1998-1999, the students of canon law may elect the law of the Eastern Catholic Churches as their specialization; this includes a special educational program, covering the entire Eastern codification, the history of legal institutions of the Eastern Catholic Churches and the elements of liturgical law and Eastern sacramental studies.

The Institute of Canon Law is governed by the Statute defining the institute's aims and responsibilities; it was approved by the Holy See and made effective on 1 October 2008. These aims and responsibilities are inter alia: to cultivate and promote the study of canon law and to train the canon law research and teaching personnel; to deliver a scholarly and practical training to the personnel involved in administration, ecclesiastical tribunals and parish ministry; to offer courses to undergraduate and postgraduate students of other majors at the University.

THE FACULTY LIBRARY

The Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration maintains two libraries: the Library of the Institute of Law and the Institute of Canon Law on the premises of John Paul II College (Collegium Ioannis Pauli II) and the Library of the Institute of Administration and the Institute of European Studies on the premises of Collegium Iuridicum.

The book collections are available in the first place to researchers and students of the faculty. However, the libraries also admit persons from outside the faculty.

The book collection comprises ample law and canon law literature. The most valuable titles are old prints (131 volumes) of canon law, Roman law, church history and universal history. The oldest works date back to the early sixteenth century. Currently, due to the requirement of proper storage, they are deposited with the University Main Library.

The library reading room can seat 38 students and offers computer terminals equipped with the legal information system (LEX). The collection is catalogued in a traditional way (card catalogue) and has been undergoing a gradual digitalization since 2000. The library is overseen by Ms. Jadwiga Surdacka.

SCHOOL OF UKRAINIAN LAW

The School of Ukrainian Law School was established as an independent entity in October 2004. The opening of the school followed the signature of agreements on cooperation between the Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration, Catholic University of Lublin and the Faculty of Law, Ivan Franko National University in Lviv and the State Academy of National Economy in Tarnopol (now State University of National Economy in Tarnopol).

The school's objective is to share the knowledge about the legal system of Ukraine, as well as popularizing the economic and cultural development of the country. In the future, this should result in the strengthening of mutual contacts and cooperation between the Catholic University of Lublin and the scientific centers in Ukraine. In the longer

term, the school's activity may contribute to reinforcing cultural ties and common interests between the two nations.

Now, the school offers specialized courses in the rudiments of Ukrainian law - it is a full-time master course for students taking law as a major (from the third year) - and a two-semester postgraduate program on the same subject available to all university graduates. The lectures cover the basic fields of Ukrainian law and are delivered by the academics of the Catholic University of Lublin and Ukrainian universities. The students having no or limited conduct of Ukrainian have the opportunity to join a language course.



POSTGRADUATE QUALIFICATION PROGRAM IN ADMINISTRATION: RECORDING OF CIVIL STATUS

The Postgraduate Qualification Program in Administration: Recording of Civil Status was created in the academic year 2008/2009 as the first postgraduate course of this kind in Poland. This initiative addressed the demand for improvement of the quality of registration of civil status in Poland. In this way, the faculty being an important center of deliberation on the rules and regulations concerning the registration of civil status (the faculty hosted, for example, international conferences such as: Family Law in Poland and Europe - 2004, Family Law in Poland and Ukraine: the Experience, Change, Collaboration - 2007, and the symposium: Family Law in the Time of Transformation. Current Problems of the Recording of Civil Status - 2009) wishes to have its say in the quality training of civil servants working in registry offices.

The program is tailored to meet the needs of registrars at different hierarchy levels, local government officials acting in the structures of



municipal offices, supervisory authorities of voivodeship offices, as well as those who intend to work in civil registry offices and have to do with the registration of civil status.

The program includes 270 hours of lectures and seminars, including classes in law, administration, laws on the acts of civil status, psychology, IT and analysis of document authenticity. The classes are taught by tutors from the Catholic University of Lublin, Warsaw University and Gdańsk University. Among the lecturers, there are also judges, lawyers, notaries, supervisory bodies, instructors delegated by the Association of Polish Registrars, IT specialists implementing computer systems supporting the recording of civil status.

POSTGRADUATE PROGRAM IN INTERNAL AUDIT IN THE PUBLIC FINANCE SECTOR

The program content focuses on internal auditing and the system of internal control in public administration.

The course is designed for employees of public administration and its affiliated bodies that are required to employ internal auditors and perform auditing procedures. The program participant is able to acquire the skills necessary to work as an internal auditor and after graduation will be able to sit an examination to obtain a certificate of internal auditor in accordance with the Public Finance Act.

CENTER FOR AMERICAN LAW

The Center for American Law (CAL) has been functioning at the Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration since 1998 and plays a vital part in the development of research and didactic cooperation between the faculty staff and professors representing a number of American research centers. Since the academic year 2008/2009, the classes have been incorporated in courses taught by the Institute of Law.

From 1998 through 2002, CAL operated within the Department of History of State and Law. Thanks to the American Bar Association and the program of legal culture development in the countries of East-Central Europe, the spring of 1998 saw the first Lublin-based lectures in English considering various issues of American law. Meanwhile, the faculty began to network with the Chicago-Kent Law School, Illinois Institute of Technology. The cooperation of Prof. R. Warner, Prof. D.R. Swenson and Prof. G. Górski culminated in the opening of the Center for American Law on 1 March 1999. The agreement sanctioning the integration of the School of American Law with the then Faculty of Canon and Secular Law was signed by the deans: Rev. Prof. Marian Stasiak and Prof. Henry H. Perritt, Jr. of the Chicago-Kent Law School.

Today, CAL offers 17 elective subjects with English as the language of instruction. Having successfully completed twelve selected courses within 6 semesters, the graduate is awarded the certificate of graduation from the School of American Law. The regular classes held at the school are: American constitutional law, legal advocacy, torts, human rights in practice, criminal law (alternated with criminal procedure), negotiation (Prof. D.R. Swenson),

American judicial system (Prof. G. Górski), bankruptcy law, family law (K. Maćkowska, PhD), legal reasoning, research and writing, moot court (M. Rzeszót, MA); the school also offers immersion courses delivered by visiting American lawyers. In cooperation with the Chicago-Kent College of Law, the school hosted the following lectures: Legal Drafting (C. Webber), International Business Transactions (D. Gerber), Mergers&Acquisitions (Ch. Leslie, S. Cho), Introduction to Business Law (T. Hill), Comparative Law (S. Harding), Securities Law (M. Scodro), Judicial Decision-Making (V. Gross).

A permanent cooperation has also been established with Mr. Charles F.X. Szymanski, a lawyer and acting director of the American Corner at the University of Łódź, who teaches classes in arbitration.

In 2006, the faculty exchanged correspondence with the Centre for International Legal Studies based in Salzburg, Austria. The director of the centre, Prof. Dennis Campbell, advanced the proposal that the Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration should participate in his project of gathering a team of experienced American lawyers, wishing to promote the knowledge about the American legal system in East-Central Europe.

The Catholic University of Lublin was a Polish pioneer of this program.

Since its inception, CAL has been actively engaged in research projects not only at but also outside the University. For instance, it co-organized a number of international conferences such as: Poland: Ten Years of Economic Transformation (1999); Transformation of Judicial Law in Europe and the World in the Nineteenth Century (2000); Safety on the Internet (2002); The United States of America after 9/11: International and Legal Repercussions (2003); Visa - a Passport to a Better World, or Merely a Political Bargain Counter? (2008, in cooperation with the Forum of Young Diplomats).



THE CENTER FOR ADVANCING LEGAL SKILLS

The Center for Advancing Legal Skills (CALS) was established at the Faculty of Law, Catholic University of Lublin, to facilitate legal skills development among law students and legal practitioners. The founder of the center is Prof. Delaine R. Swenson.

Hitherto, the importance of legal skills development has been a neglected aspect of legal education in Poland. Yet, quality academic education must be balanced with solid legal skills.

In pursuing its objectives, for some years, the center has been organizing the High School Moot Court Competition. The project aims at promoting rhetorical skills and legal English among high schoolers. The competition involves the participants role-playing a US mock jury trial in English. They assume the roles of lawyers, prosecutors and witnesses.

The center invites students and legal practitioners to take part in moots so designed as to help develop confidence in handling actual trials. In parallel with the moots, training program are put in place covering legal rhetoric, human rights, negotiation and alternative dispute resolution.

The participation in mock trials gives students the

opportunity of practising the skills and knowledge acquired during university classes. Mock trials simulate U.S. court hearings (criminal and civil). In addition the Center runs an extensive international moot court program for University students that includes trials before the International Court of Justice, European Court of Human Rights, the Court of Justice of the European Union, as well as simulations of the European Union Constitutional Convention and Oxford-style debates.

One of the major projects of the centre is Street Law - Everyday Law program. Properly trained law students conduct a series of classes in high schools using interactive teaching methods. Doing so, they acquire both substantive knowledge and methodological competence. On the other hand, the high school pupils participating in such classes become familiar with some essential legal problems and obtain a wealth of useful information on law enforcement and application. The classes address practical issues, directly affecting young people. Among the discussed issues, there are: human rights, citizen's rights before the police, protection of personal rights, consumer rights, civil contracts concluded by minors, family relations and the right to good administration, protection of intellectual property rights on the Internet, corruption and methods of combating it. To date, the centre has trained over 100 law students - the project participants, who in turn trained about 3000 pupils from Lublin and the Lublin region.

Students gathered in the circle increase their scientific interest and practical skills by using the potential offered by technological progress. One of the statutory objectives of the academic circle is to broaden legal knowledge by organizing and participating in conferences, lectures, workshops and professional training. The circle members travel to

visit scientific institutions in the country and abroad. The Law Students' Academic Circle is divided in four scientific sections: Section of Ancient Laws, Section of Criminal Law, Section of Private Law and Section of Public Law.

Students' engagement helps gain experience and skills needed in their future work. It is also a chance to meet prominent personalities of science and politics. Many of the current staff of the Faculty of Law were actively involved in the academic circle during their studies. The conferences organized and coordinated by the circle during the so-called Lawyers' Week enjoy keen interest of the academia. They are held annually in late April and early May. 

UNIVERSITY LEGAL CLINIC

The idea of university legal clinics was conceived in the United States. Its primary purpose is to increase the availability of free legal aid to the most impoverished members of the community, and consequently, to foster the development of the foundations of civil society by facilitating the protection of individuals' subjective rights by means of any available legal means. For the law students who provide support under the supervision of University academics, to participate in the clinic teaches the practical application of classroom knowledge and correct identification and effective solution-finding for actual legal issues. It also teaches the right approach to individuals who face and report such problems and are often in a very difficult life situation; it also supports readiness to pro bono activity. The clinic is open to students of final classes, admitted after an enrolment procedure.

Pursuant to the an agreement between the Catholic University of Lublin and the Lublin Municipality, the students involved in the clinic have their duty hours in the offices of district councils: Bronowice, the Old Town, Tatary, South Węglin and Wieniawa. The clinic also collaborates with the Lublin branch of Caritas charitable organization, the Regional Information Centre for Victims of Crimes and Offences and with the Little Brothers of the Poor Association. The activity of the clinic enjoys a growing interest, as evidenced by the rising number of cases it is currently handling, as well as by the circle of local government units and NGOs interested in maintaining cooperation.



Since 2010 overseen by Institute of European Studies. The Head of the Institute is also editor-in-chief (present: Artur Kuś) The editorial board place their hopes on the appointment of a new international Scientific Council of the Review, with such outstanding names as Paolo Carozza (Notre Dame), Xiangshun Ding (Beijing), Volodymyr Motyl (Lviv), James White (Indianapolis), Ewald Eisenberg and Christa Tobler.

Ecclesiastical Procedural Law. Materials and Studies ("Kościelne Prawo Procesowe. Materiały i Studia") - a publication series coming out since 1999 and overseen by the Department of Ecclesiastical Procedural Law. The articles published concern the issues of matrimonial law, Polish family

Studies in Ecclesiastical Law

("Studia z Prawa Wyznaniowego") - a scientific journal published by the Department of Ecclesiastical Law since 2000.
